## **CFA Program Curriculum**

The Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) exam is a rigorous, three-level program evaluating candidate knowledge of investment management and financial analysis. Each level builds on previous knowledge and skills, with specific objectives to assess candidates' competency per the CFA Institute Learning Outcome Statements (LOS) Outlines.

### **CFA Exam Format**

All levels include multiple-choice questions (MCQ). For Levels II and III, MCQs are integrated into vignettes, which are short case studies describing business scenarios. Level III also includes constructed response (essay) sets.

#### **Meet Education Requirement**

To register for Level I, candidates must have a bachelor's degree or be within 23 months of graduation. For Level II, they must be within 11 months of graduation.



Exams are administered four times per year for Level I, three times per year for Level II, and twice per year for Level III.

#### **Pass Exams**

To pass, candidates need to achieve a minimum passing score (MPS) that is determined after each testing window. Each level requires about 300 hours of study and 10–15 hours of Practical Skills Modules (PSM).

#### **Obtain Work Experience**

Before, during, or after participating in the CFA program, candidates must complete 4,000 hours of professional experience in investment decision-making over a minimum of 36 months.
